## DeKalb CEO Michael Thurmond To Give Reading/Signing At Lithonia Woman's Club

On March 5, Thurmond will read from his newest book, "James Oglethorpe, Father of Georgia," which reexamines Oglethorpe's legacy from slave trader to abolitionist.

**Lithonia, GA** – History is coming alive in the City of Granite. CEO of DeKalb County and historian Michael Thurmond will be at the Lithonia Woman's Club on March 5 at 10am to read from his new book *James Oglethorpe, Father of Georgia*. In addition to the reading, the event will feature a short Q&A, signing and reception with coffee, tea and brunchy bites. The Arabia Mountain National Heritage Area is proud to sponsor this event in the Lithonia Woman's Club, which housed DeKalb County's first public library.

"In one of my meetings with Michael Thurmond he told me, 'I'm a historian first, and an attorney second,' and I never forgot that," said Revonda Cosby, Executive Director of the Arabia Alliance that manages the national heritage area 20 minutes east of Atlanta. "I'm not surprised that the historian Thurmond would take us on a journey of learning about men we did not know much about and illuminating this connection between the benefits of antislavery activism that still serve us well today. I'm proud to have CEO Thurmond and his pen in the National Heritage Area in Lithonia."

James Oglethorpe, Father of Georgia closely explores Oglethorpe's evolving attitude toward African Americans through his intellectual relationships with two formerly enslaved men: Ayuba Suleiman Diallo and Olaudah Equiano, who wrote a bestselling autobiography about his abduction from Africa by slave traders and the horrors of the Middle Passage. Readers will be surprised to learn that Oglethorpe set up the Georgia colony as a unique social welfare experiment for England's "worthy poor." Due to Oglethorpe's advocacy, Georgia was the only British American colony to ban chattel slavery before the Revolutionary War.
