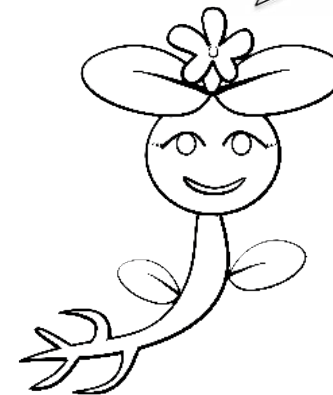

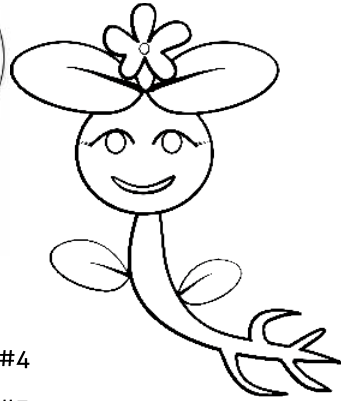
Panola Mountain State Park Scavenger Hunt

Complete the crossword puzzle. You'll find the answers during your adventure, then get your prize back at the Nature Center!

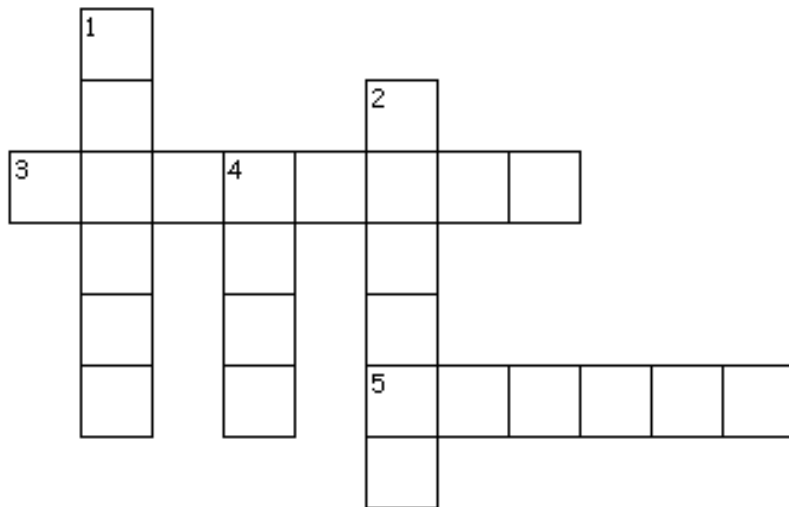
